NDPA OFFERS 2 NEW PART TIME JOB OPPORTUNITIES:

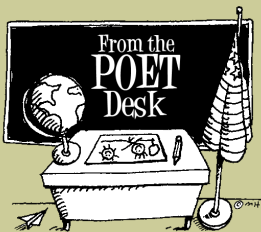
