Traffic Reminder on Hill Field Rd.

Parents,
Layton City Police Department in cooperation with NDPA, set the procedure for drop off and pick up on Hill Field Rd. Failure to correctly follow the traffic instructions may result in an extremely expensive traffic violation, injury or accident.

Remember, no U turns are allowed in front of school property at any time. Parents must enter the drop off and pick up line west of Cold Creek Rd behind the red curb. You are requested to remain there until traffic ahead is clear before proceeding forward. When you prepare to exit the loading and unloading area, you must pull forward beyond the school before safely entering traffic. Again, **NO U TURNS** are allowed in front of school property in either direction.

Please be courteous to those already in line by waiting for your turn. Thanks for your help in this!

Below I have listed some figures that I hope will be Helpful. This amount would be what you will need if your students balance was at \$0.00 following lunch on Friday Feb.22, 2008.

Month of March	\$ 27.20	\$ 6.80
Month of April	\$ 33.60	\$ 8.40
Month Of May	\$ 33.60	\$ 8.40
End of the Year	\$ 102.40	\$ 25.60

Please remember these prices DO NOT include any individual child's account balance which could be negative, positive, or zero. You must make the mathematical adjustments accordingly.

Science Fair Tip Of The Week:

"Oh no! My science fair project didn't work the way I thought it would!" What do you do if your hypothesis – the prediction you made when you started your project – turns out to be wrong? Believe it or not, that's OK! Scientists learn as much from their mistakes as they do from their successes. If your project isn't turning out the way you thought it would, here's what you do: First, write down everything you did and all your measurements. Then, in your conclusion, explain what you think happened and why it turned out differently than you expected. When you use the Scientific Method to explore a question about how something works, your hypothesis might turn out to be wrong. That happens to scientists all the time. But you still learned something, didn't you? And that's what science is all about – learning! So don't be afraid to be wrong!

Our Annual Science Fair is Thursday March 6th. This means it is less than 2 weeks away! Work on your project now, don't wait until the week before.
