What do we need to do first?

Fill out a commitment form + pay a \$250 deposit online or to the Jr. High office by May 15, 2020.

How much does the trip cost?

\$3200.00 covers travel insurance, airfare and other transportation, hotels, 3 meals per day including a meal at airport layovers, CLIC school fee, host family 6 night stay, all tours, excursions, and activities. Plus their Spain jacket and backpack, and all the bottled water students can carry each day.

Should my student bring extra money?

Yes, we encourage each student to bring Euros to spend on souvenirs and snacks. For your convenience, a group Euro order will be placed through the school in February.

Will there be a fundraiser like selling wrapping paper?

No, the school supports our students in 2 ways; scholarships and summer tutoring and/or building maintenance work.

Who will be chaperoning my teenager?

Students are accompanied by NDPA teachers and administrators, CLIC teachers/tour guides, and/or their Spanish host family.

Can parents chaperone?

Parents do not qualify as school chaperones, however, any parent who would like to vacation alongside us is welcome to do so.

How do we apply for a scholarship and when will awards be given out?
